## Minutes of the Public Works Committee of February 2, 2021

#### 1. Roll Call:

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Adkins at 6:02 p.m.

Members present: Trustee Scott Adkins, Trustee Lee Uecker, Trustee Michael Bartzen, and Member Keith Markano.

Also present: Village Administrator Jeremy Smith, Assistant Village Administrator Kelsey McElroy-Anderson, Village

A quorum of the Village Board was present at the meeting.

#### 2. Consideration and possible action on minutes:

A motion by Bartzen, seconded by Markano to approve the January 5, 2021 meeting minutes as presented.

#### A. 2021 Road Program Construction Bids

Trustee Bartzen clarified that the Village would be under the initial CIP budget if the contingency isn't needed. Ms. Neu stated that this would be the case and it's staff's goal not to use the contingency, but it may be needed. Mr. Smith stated that the Village won't need to borrow for this road program. President LeDonne asked who would be inspecting the project. Ms. Neu stated that the project will be inspected by the Assistant Engineer, which will save the Village an estimated \$90.000.

A motion by Bartzen, seconded by Markano to recommend to the Village Board the award of the 2021 Road Program contract to LaLonde Contractors, Inc. per their bid for the project grand total of \$1,843,593.66, including the base bid and the alternate bid with a contingency of \$184,359.37 for a total allocation of \$2,027,953.03.

Motion carried 4-0.

#### 7. Consideration and possible action on Other Public Works Items:

Mr. Smith stated that the lease with Associated Bank is no longer needed because the Village no longer uses the Bank's land for the holiday tree. This space was needed before the Civic Center was constructed.

A motion by Adkins, seconded by Bartzen to recommend to the Village Board terminating the 2009 lease of land from Associated Bank.

Motion carried 4-0.

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#### MEMORANDUM

**Re:** West Loop Connection Water Main Connection decision

As part of the development for the Woodland Trail & Woodland Preserve subdivisions, the Developer was required to complete the design of the West Loop Connection for the water main along Plainview Road from the railroad tracks to Bluebill Drive and complete the loop with the Village paying its appropriate share of the project including inspection costs provided the Village found the share of the cost of the work acceptable. The Village share of the cost of this 1200 foot long water main is \$297,200 plus inspection costs of about 7%. I have reviewed the bids and recommend we accept this cost share as it is advantageous to the Village utility rate payers vs. performing the work on our own.

This water main loop is extremely important. Currently, the Woodland Creek, Woodland Preserve, and Woodland Trails subdivisions are served by a single water main feed from the intersection of Good Hope Road and Waukesha Avenue, a single water line nearly 2 miles long. Additionally, long dead end lines make it more difficult to keep the water fresh, reduces chlorine residual, causes sediments to build up, can impact water pressure, and can reduce fire flow. The completion of this loop has been in the long term Water Utility Infrastructure plan to be completed in conjunction with the development of these lands.

The Developer took bids and provided copies of all of the bids to the Village. The section of water main from the tracks to Bluebill is challenging to construct. There is little right of way to work with, there is mature landscaping located at or near the right of way line, the hill is steep, and there is a pole line located about 10 feet from the road. To install this water main using traditional open cut methods would be very disruptive to the lives of the residents and significantly more difficult and more expensive. Directionally drilling the water main is the least expensive option.

I have reviewed the bids for the water main work and have determined the costs are reasonable given the difficulty of the work and would not likely occur for less if the Village constructed the work on our own. Therefore, staff recommends that the Village agree to the price not to exceed \$297,200 for the water main plus the inspection costs. The Developers Agreement states that the Village would pay for the water main installation after it is accepted.

#### Application for Special Event Street Closure

A special event that requires the temporary closure of a Village street requires a permit. Special events include but are not limited to parades, athletic events, runs or walks. Applications are required to be filed with the Village Clerk's office at least 30 days prior to the event. The Clerk will then forward the application to the Village Board for consideration. The Board may approve the permit, approve the permit with conditions or deny the permit. Review of the application shall take into consideration the protection of health, safety, welfare of the Village. The protection of persons in the street closure area. The nature of activities to be held in the street. The extent of interference with traffic or emergency vehicle service in the area and repairs or other construction work in the street closure area.

Re: Engineering Monthly Report – February 2021

#### Maple Avenue and Good Hope Road:

• A Surveyor has been hired to set lot corners for the right of way purchased for these two projects.

#### Miscellaneous

- As of February 24th, we have used 1057 tons of salt. We have an allocation of 2100 tons for the season. Last year we used a total of 1,333 tons.
- Snow removal from Main Street went well. This was the first time we've had to remove the snow from the terraces since the road was reconstructed.
- DOT has started the design for the 2026 resurfacing of STH 164 from Swan Road to north of CTH Q.
- Enforcement of Spring Weight Restrictions are tentatively planned to start on March 8, 2021. We are working to coordinate the start / end dates with neighboring communities to make policing easier.

#### 2021 Road Program

- We have heard very little feedback from property owners and residents impacted by this years Road Program. They are sending back the communications forms, so we know they received the letters and are aware of the project.
- Temporary easement requests are being sent this week to a few properties along Silver Spring Drive where we need to do a little grading and driveway work outside of the right of way to match the new sidewalk.
- The preconstruction meeting is set for March 4, 2021. We expect that the contractor will start construction in late March or early April. We do not know where they plan to start.

#### Developments:

- <u>Woodland Trails:</u> Plans for phase 2 are nearly ready for approval. Developer now plans to construct the remainder of the roads in the development during this phase. Water main construction at / under the tracks is scheduled to begin next week.
- Sussex Preserve: Phase 3 utility work continues. The hope is to be paving in mid-June.
- <u>Vista Run:</u> Full construction plans have been reviewed and are back in the designer's hands. The developer would like to start construction in early April.
- <u>Town of Lisbon's Lied's Development:</u> We are working with the Town and their engineers on a layout and agreement that will provide a water main loop between Main Street and Silver Spring Drive.
- <u>Highlands Business Park:</u> Plans for the sewer and water extension for the future development on the north half of the Brown farm have been reviewed and are back in the designer's hands.
