### Minutes of the Park & Recreation Board meeting held on March 16, 2021.

### 1. Roll call

### 2. Meeting Minutes

A motion by Tetting; Seconded by Waltz to approve the minutes from the February 16, 2021 meeting as presented. Motion Carried 7-0

### 4. Wolverine Fireworks Display, Inc. Fireworks Contract

A motion by Waltz; seconded by Wells to approve the fireworks contract as presented.

### 5. Village Park Concession Stand Contract

A motion by Waltz; seconded by Coenen to approve the contract as presented.

Motion Carried 7-0

### 6. Farmers Market Applications

Dobbeck presented the memo in the packet and introduced Linda Saladin and Gabe Kolasari to the Park Board to further discuss their proposed markets.

**Saladin** corrected the memo to state that they would be prepared to start the market with a summer market in late May 2021. Their tentative plan would be to operate every other Sunday unless vendors requested a weekly market.

**Kolasari** clarified his position to state that his company, Polar Bear Kitchen, would not be on any signs or promotion of the Community Market. He said he is not doing the market to make money and will donate monthly net profits to a local non-profit. He plans to operate the market every Sunday. Kolasari said he would be using his father and friends as resources for starting the market. Waltz stated that if we are committed to offering a market, then the board needs to be prepared to make concessions on the fees.

Park Board concensus was that the same fee structure, as historically offered to non-profit markets, should be offered to both the proposed non-profit and for-profit markets. Park Board also came to a concensus on requesting a seasonal summary of donations from the market. They preferred that there are no road closures for the market but will reevaluate after the market begins if there are pedestrian safety concerns.

Coenen, Votjas, Wells, and Waltz voted in favor of the Polar Bear Kitchen Community Market. Tetting, Kostka, and Fourness voted in favor of the Sussex Farmers Market.

A motion by Wells; seconded by Coenen to recommend to Village Board the approval of The Polar Bear Kitchen (Kolasari) to operate the Community Market on Sundays from 9am-1pm at the Civic Center and to offer him:

-Historic Fee Structure (Free Summer Plaza, \$125/market Winter facility space) -No road closure

-Community Market promotion must contain no for-profit promotion
-Must provide a seasonal summary of donations
-Exempt from the Food Truck Policy

### 7. Future Park Developments

Dobbeck shared about the future park developments (Vista Run Subdivision Park, Sledding Hill Park from Lannon Stone, and Prides Crossing Park update) as requested by Park Board at the February meeting.

### 8. Park & Recreation Director's Report

The Village Board tabled the **Batting Cages** for a month in hopes that a community organization may be able to fund the additional funds that the Jr. Chargers are seeking. Dobbeck reached out the SAS Club, Lions Club and SYLBA to consider funding options. The SAS Club is interested in the project and we will hopefully have an update at the April Park Board Meeting.

**Fence** Dobbeck met with the Pickleball Advisory Committee to seek input on the Multisport Court fence. The committee recommended minor changes in fence height (from 4-5 ft.) and added a gate on NE side. Contractors were able to obtain bids starting last Wednesday. The bid opening is Thursday March 25 at 10am.

**Tree City** The Village of Sussex was awarded its first Tree City designation for 2020. We will be celebrating this at our Arbor Day celebration on Friday April 30 from 5-7pm.

The **Egg Drop** is Saturday from 9-11am. We are full at 70 kids per time slot and 4 time slots every 30 minutes. We are excited to host our first in person event in over a year.

Splash Pad will open Friday, May 28 for Memorial Day weekend.

**I Run the Village 5K Update** The I Run the Village 5k committee met last week and are planning to move forward with the run this year. We are planning to add on a "I Run the Park 1K" for a kids fun run that will be offered free of charge.

We will be purchasing **bleachers** for A4 diamond from Family Strong Sussex who no longer has a need for them.

Pints in the Park voting is done – Ridgeview and Madeline won.

**Summer Activity Guide** has gone to print – session starts in May. We will be bringing back Senior Cards, Blood Pressure Checks and Book Club.


4.a. During the March 23, 2021 Village Board meeting, the Village Board reviewed the Park Board recommendation to allow Gabe Kolesari to operate a Community Market on the Civic Center Plaza. Prior to this meeting, the Village Board did receive an opinion letter by the Village attorney, John Macy, citing concern with a lack of policy surrounding this decision. At the meeting, the board had significant debate and many new aspects were introduced into the conversation. Ultimately, the Village Board acted on the follow motion unanimously:

Motion by Stallings, seconded by Uecker to approve the Sussex VFW to run and manage the Sussex Community Market per the submitted operating plan with the following contingencies: The market will not have more than four food-trucks per event and that the Park & Recreation Director will have final say on their placement; that the Village of Sussex will work with the Community Market in promotion of the event, that there will be no direct-sale vendors allowed, that no motorized vehicles will be allowed on the grass in front of the Civic Center, that they will be subject to the Operating Plan submitted to staff and they will be subject to the Standard Rental Policies. The VFW must also go before the Park & Recreation Committee in one years' time to review their first year and address any issues that may have arisen. Staff are also directed to work with the Park & Recreation Committee to review the Village's rental policy in respect to the front of the Civic Center and Civic Center Parking Lot.

As a result of this motion, the Park and Recreation Board should consider the following:

- 1. Should the Civic Center Plaza and/or the Civic Center Parking Lot be rentable spaces (beyond for the non-profit Community Market)?
  - a. If yes, should there be a differentiation between for-profit rental pricing and non-profit rental pricing?

4.b. During the April 13, 2021 Village Board meeting, the Village Board was presented with the low bid (\$37,400) for the multisport court fencing (as was approved by Public Works committee). The Village Board unanimously voted to send the fence back to the Park Board suggesting that other options be explored as they (generally speaking) did not like the aesthetics of the fence at the entrance of the park.
