**Minutes of the Village Board – Budget Meeting held on September 16, 2021.**

**1. Roll Call**

The meeting was called to order at 5:37 pm by President LeDonne.

Members Present: Greg Zoellick, Lee Uecker, President Anthony LeDonne, Ron Wells, Scott Adkins, Stacy Riedel, and Benjamin Jarvis.

Members Excused: None

Staff present: Village Administrator Jeremy Smith, Assistant Village Administrator Kelsey McElroy-Anderson, Finance Director Nancy Whalen, Village Engineer Judy Neu, Director of Police Services Capt. Lisa Panas, Fire Chief Kris Grod, Library Director Adele Loria, Parks and Recreation Director Halie Dobbeck.

**2. Discussion on 2022 Budget**

Discussion on the Options list of the 2022 budget occurred. The Board recommended the following items:

- Citizen Survey: This item was tabled and staff was directed to get pricing for benchmark data for similar sized communities.

- Pickleball Solution: There was consensus to use American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds to implement a Pickleball solution that doesn't exceed \$150,000.

- Shade Structure and Additional Lounge Chairs at Splashpad: There was consensus not to purchase the lounge chairs or the shade structure at this time.  
Yes 0, No 7
- Bathroom at Sledding Hill: The Board would like to first use a port-a-john to determine how frequently it's used before investing in a more expensive facility. The Board voted unanimously not to fund the bathroom at the sledding hill.

- Shelter at Prides Park: A majority of the Board supported using impact fees to fund the shelter at Prides Park. Present LeDonne asked the Park Board to explore if this facility should be rentable.

- Swimming Pool Feasibility Study: The Board wanted additional time to consider this item so it was tabled.

- Vista Run Park Design Plan: There was unanimous support to use cash capital funds to pay for this design.

- Lisbon Stone Family Park Improvements: There was support to use the additional park depreciation funds and park impact fees to fund this project.

- Additional Speed Radar Speed Signs: The Board would like to see the current radar speed signs moved more frequently.

- Street Light at Pick n' Save Entrance on Main Street: Trustee Adkins stated that the intersection is dark and he would like to see additional lighting.

- Street Light at Weaver Drive and Main Street: This item was added to the options list at the request of a resident.

- Programmable Blinking Pedestrian Lights: There was unanimous support to add programmable blinking pedestrian lights at two Bug Line crossings – Main Street across from the Public Safety Building and on Silver Spring near Main Street.

- Continue Infrastructure Depreciation: The full amount requested of \$100,000 was funded.  
Yes 5, No 2
- Increase Depreciation of Park Playground: The full amount requested of \$60,000 was funded.

- Generator at Civic Center: There was unanimous support to use ARPA funds for this replacement.  
Yes 7, No 0
- Additional Money for Salt: This item was not funded.  
Yes 0, No 7
- Roller: The full amount requested was funded.  
Yes 6, No 1
- Additional Security Cameras at the Civic Center: There was a compromise to use operating funds for the upfront cost and to increase the tax levy to fund the ongoing depreciation.  
Yes 7, No 0
- Revenue – Baseball Field Rental Fees: The Board voted unanimously to increase the baseball field rental fees as recommended for 2022 and 2023. They would like to review the fees again in 2024.

- Revenue – Rush Special Assessment Letter: This item was approved as recommended.
